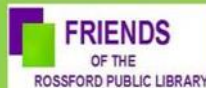


Crowds gathered on the lawn to hear some awesome summertime music. At right: Swingmania performs a Frank Sinatra tune on June 19th.

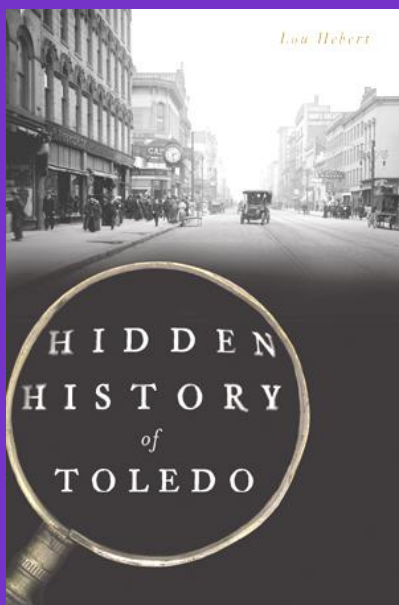
Staff Spotlight On: Circulation Clerk Judy Pucci
